Tashika began to use remote learning as a powerful tool in 2019 when civil unrest in Bolivia prevented students from attending school safely.

It was a challenge, but when the Covid pandemic soon followed, I had a revelation of the importance of teaching effectively in a virtual setting. I could see it was the beginning of a new era. So I began proactively seeking professional development through ACSI, the Accreditation for Christian Schools, to learn as much as possible about teaching remotely.

And learn she did! Tashika said this about teaching and learning in the virtual space: Providing hands-on learning opportunities in the classroom is important, so using resources in a virtual environment that are equally impactful at engaging students is key. Maneuvering the remote environment in a way that not only mimics but also enhances person-to-person interactions is what I strive to deliver to my students when I tutor.

What Tashika said about working with BookNook:

I started picking up classes in December last year. I was nervous at first about organizing the content and resources within the session time, but now I'm confident working consistently with the students I serve. I also appreciate the workshops and tips BookNook provides for tutors to continue our development.
